






## John 4:28-42


Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony... And because of his words many more became believers.





## John 9:15-41




**Luke 5:14** "go show yourself to the priest ... as a testimony."

Luke 5:29 Then Levi held a great banquet for Jesus at his house and a large crowd of tax collectors and others were eating with them."






Mark 5:19 Jesus ... said "Go home to your family and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you."







Like Paul, we can tell our story in three parts:


- 1. My life before I met Christ.

What kinds of things might be in your story?


- What were you putting your faith in before you met Christ?

- Some friends at church Hearing their story will help you learn to tell your own story.







Make a list of the people you would like to tell your story to.

Include a Bible verse as part of your story.








Be ready whenever God brings someone across your path. Ask their permission and tell your story every chance you get.









## My story goes like this:


A friend asked me several times during a 6-month time period if I would like to come visit the youth group at their church.
After 6 months of saying "no" I finally said "yes".






I didn't grow up in a home where we went to church a lot, so everything was new to me. I was kind of watching and soaking things in for several weeks. At a Bible study, the pastor said we were going to study what the Bible said about having a





personal relationship with God. He read verses about God's love, my sin, Christ's death on the cross and how I could have faith. I heard the verse Rom 10:13 and I knew I had never done that. I prayed that day and asked Christ to forgive me and change me.
